The correct methods of electrofishing with a back pack and generator system are covered in theory and practical sessions. As well as reinforcing the health and safety. Fish identification and processing fish are taught and practised as well as setting stop nets.

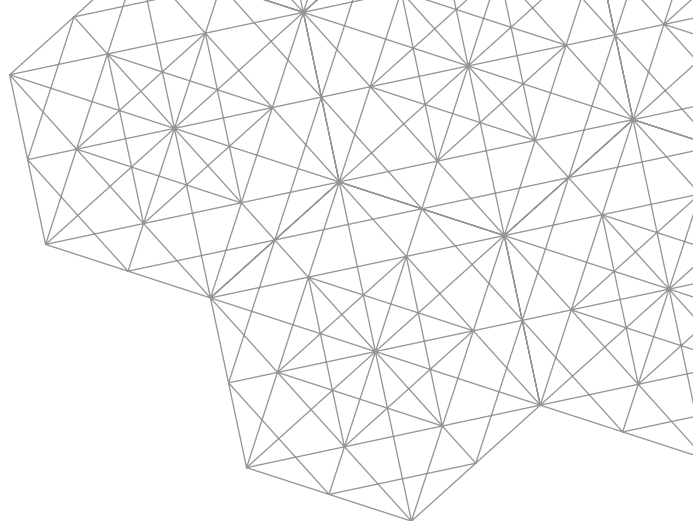
